Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend approval of the auditing contract extension with Yeo & Yeo, CPAs & Business Consultants for fiscal years ending June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2026. Yeo & Yeo will be paid according to the following schedule FY 2022 - \$65,200, FY 2023 - \$69,750, FY 2024 - \$73,250, FY 2025 - \$76,900, FY 2026 - \$80,750, for an amount not to exceed \$365,850 for the five-year period.

Justification:

Yeo & Yeo was selected as the auditors in 2011 after extensive review of multiple auditing firms. Yeo & Yeo was selected due to their exemplary proposal, number of staff assigned to the project and great cost savings to the city. The firm has performed well, is thorough in their analysis, and has significant knowledge of how the City operates.

Since the City has been pleased with the firm's performance, the City Manager requested a proposal for an extension of their contract. Yeo & Yeo will provide the same services and proposed fees with nominal increases similar to the previous schedule.

This vendor meets all requirements of §14.33, "Vendors," of "Purchasing, Contracting, and Selling Procedure," of Chapter 14, "Finance and Purchasing," of Title I, "Administrative Code," of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-204.

Funds are budgeted in the General Fund, Department of Fiscal Services – Controller Division's Professional Services, Account No. 101-1741-801.000 for FY 2022 and pending approval will be budgeted in the same account for FY 2023 through 2026.

Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend approval of a purchase and a Service License Agreement with Pivot Point Partners, LLC for \$11,500.00 for mobile appraisal software for the Fiscal Services Department, Assessing Division.

Justification:

The City's Assessing Division is requesting the purchase of Pivot Point Partners, LLC's Mobile Appraisal Software. The current process for property appraisal by City staff requires a multiple step process, focusing on a paper based workflow and hand entry into our Assessing software program. Staff assess approximately 5,000 properties per year using the current paper process. By utilizing Mobile Appraisal software, the paper process will turn to a cloud based digital assessing work flow, that will integrate data from the mobile tablet directly into the City's assessing software program, eliminating hand entry and reducing errors.

This vendor meets all requirements of §14.33, "Vendors," of "Purchasing, Contracting, and Selling Procedure," of Chapter 14, "Finance and Purchasing," of Title I, "Administrative Code," of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-204.

Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend the approval of the service agreements with Mercury Consulting for \$31,877.50 for Email Migration, Application Migration, Development Services and software for the Technical Services Department.

Justification:

The Technical Services Department has been in the process of evaluating and selecting products that will modernize and consolidate the City's existing email, workflow, and Microsoft Office Products. Microsoft Office 365 has been selected along with Cloud Exchange Email. Migration and development services of existing mail databases, workflows, and new application development to replace older ones are needed. Mercury consulting has done multiple migrations and application development similar to what the City requires. After this migration, the City's strategic direction will be more focused on enabling higher security, modernizing and allowing the convenience of access, better disaster recovery for applications and email, scalability of products, and more efficient real-time communications. This process will have cost savings by removing in-house servers, hardware, and software maintenance to run applications that will now reside on the secure Cloud.

Three quotes were requested, two were received from the following vendors to help in the email migration, workflow, application, and program development for the Technical Services Department. The following is a listing of the quotes received:

Justification:

In FY 2022, the purchase orders listed below were issued to the vendors in the amount of \$80,000. The City's Municipal Garage requires parts from these vendors for various repairs from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022.

In FY 2021, the Garage spent \$13,811.70 on parts from AIS Construction Equipment. In the current fiscal year, we have spent \$19,987.23 leaving a balance of \$3,012.77. The Garage purchases wear parts to maintain John Deere Equipment used by the Cemeteries, and Maintenance and Service Divisions from this vendor.

In FY 2021, the Garage spent \$35,841.70 on parts from Larry's Auto Supply. In the current fiscal year, we have spent \$37,101.93 leaving a balance of \$7,898.07. The Garage purchases filters and other maintenance parts for the entire fleet from this vendor.

In FY 2021, the Garage spent \$9,596.91 on parts from Spartan Distributors. In the current fiscal year, we have spent \$10,601.09 leaving a balance of \$1,398.91. The Garage purchases wear and maintenance items for mowers used by the Parks and Cemeteries Divisions from this vendor.

Due to the current economy many vendors have had to increase their prices, while keeping their pricing competitive. There are no feasible means to predetermine what parts or services will be needed. AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATION OF AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS TO PAY FOR GENERAL GOVERNMENTAL SERVICES TO THE EXTENT OF LOST REVENUES AND EMPLOYEE WORKERS COMPENSATION AND MEDICAL EXPENSES DUE TO THE COVID-19 VIRUS

WHEREAS: on March 11, 2021 the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) was signed into law and established the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) program which is intended to provide support to State, territorial, local and tribal governments in response to the economic and public health impacts of COVID; and

WHEREAS: the U.S. Department of Treasury has issued Compliance and Reporting Guidance which outlines each recipient's compliance and reporting responsibilities under the SLFRF program; and

WHEREAS: the U.S. Department of Treasury's Final Rule, published on January 6, 2022, and effective April 1, 2022, clarifies that recipients can use SLFRF funds on governmental services up to the revenue loss amount calculated using the Final Rule four-step process; and

WHEREAS: some common examples of "government services" expressly recognized by Treasury are as follows:

- Road building and maintenance, and other infrastructure
- Health services
- General government administration, staff, and administrative facilities
- Environmental remediation
- Provision of police, fire, and other public safety services (including purchase of fire trucks and police vehicles)
- Maintenance or pay-go funded building infrastructure
- Modernization of cybersecurity, including hardware, software, and protection of critical infrastructure

WHEREAS: "Government services is [deemed by Treasury] the most flexible eligible use category under the SLFRF program, and funds are subject to streamlined reporting and compliance requirements;" and

WHEREAS: the intention of ARPA is for the funding to be actually spent, not banked, to avoid layoffs and stimulate the economy. City staff has developed a number of potential projects that might qualify under this continuation of services and revenue loss category for consideration; and

WHEREAS: consistent with U.S. Department Treasury guidance the City of Saginaw has performed revenue replacement calculations, which indicate a City revenue loss of \$6,126,945 for Fiscal Year 2020 and \$6,578,857 for Fiscal Year 2021 based upon the comparison of the base Fiscal Year 2019. Fiscal Year 2022 and Fiscal Year 2023 will be further evaluated and a calculation performed. The four year total revenue loss is currently

estimated at \$25,000,000. A copy of the cost revenue calculation is attached as Addendum A; and

WHEREAS: the U.S. Department of Treasury's Final Rule also states that ARPA funds may be used in the response to Public Health and the Negative Economic Impacts of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS: the City of Saginaw incurred employee medical expenses of \$561,057 and workers compensation claims of \$803,197 due to employee exposure to COVID -19.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. The City Manager, Finance Director, and the Director of the Office of Management and Budget are authorized to allocate \$25,000,000, representing City lost revenue, from the American Rescue Plan Fund to compensate the City for lost revenue and to fund government services traditionally provided.

2. Projects paid for with these funds serve the objectives of the Act by providing services traditionally provided by a government, namely:

- ☐ Police protection
- ☐ Fire and emergency medical services
- ☐ Road repair, maintenance and other transportation and safety services
- ☐ Public infrastructure support
- ☐ General government administration and administrative facilities
- ☐ Land use regulations and enforcement
- ☐ Parks and recreational facilities and programs

Accordingly, the Projects paid for with these funds are in the best interest of the City of Saginaw and are deemed a priority for the community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

1. The City Manager, Finance Director, and the Director of the Office of Management and Budget are authorized to allocate \$561,057 from the American Rescue Plan Act Funds to cover employee medical expenses caused by the COVID-19 virus, and \$803,197 to cover worker's compensation costs of those city employees as part of the City's response to the public health & negative economic impact of COVID-19.

3. We pledge our commitment to show courtesy, by treating all colleagues, staff, and members of the public in a professional and courteous manner whether in person, online, or in written communication, especially when we disagree; and
4. We pledge our commitment to avoid rhetoric and refrain from making slanderous, profane, or personal remarks intended to humiliate, malign, or question the motivation of those whose opinions are different from ours in all our meetings; and
