Call to Order/Roll Call:

Chair Hanley called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

Moved by Commissioner Teneyuque, seconded by Vice Chair Bulls to approve the March 12, 2026, regular meeting minutes. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion approved.

- 1. Education** – Discussion was held on an informational brochure that Commissioners can hand out with their letter of introduction. Clerk Bolzman will draft one similar to the Citizens-Police Advisory Commission.
- 2. Community Partner Contacts** – Discussion was held on commissioners sending Chair Hanley the names of any individuals or groups that they have contact with for the compilation of a list of community stakeholders in prevention efforts and advocacy. Attorney Lusk advised that a discrimination lawsuit cannot be filed without a complaint first to either the Michigan Department of Civil Rights or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, so it is important that any referral list of community organizations include those two entities.
- 3. Resource Guide** – Further discussion will be had when the list of who the notification email went to is available and the list of Community Partner Contacts can be compiled.
